THE GAETANO FEDERICI **CONSERVATION PROJECT: AN UPDATE**

As many of our members may be aware, in January of this year the Society began a large project to conserve, and restore the works by Gaetano Federici held within its collection. Partly this project was motivated by the rekindled interest in this Paterson sculptor after William Paterson University's Dr. Parrillo aired his documentary Gaetano Federici: The Sculptor Laureate of Paterson on Public Broadcasting in April.

The initial goals of the project were to conserve and restore twenty-one plaster pieces created by Federici and incorporate these items in an exhibit. In the course of cataloging material from our off-site storage area, at least seven more plaster pieces have been located and will also be incorporated into the project.

At the time of this writing, we are glad to report that two of the Federici works have been conserved and four more pieces have sponsors. In addition, a model of the Monsignor Stein statue in Passaic which was sculpted by one of Federici's competitors will also be restored and incorporated into the exhibit. This great news is thanks to the efforts of the Knights of Columbus St. Phillips the Apostle Council (Clifton) and Juan Perez Council (Passaic) as well as the Clifton Lodge No. 657 of the Loyal Order of the Moose, the North Jersey Federal Credit Union and a few generous individuals.



HATBANDS AND HUMPHREY BOGART

Odd and interesting connections between Passaic County and the rest of the world are continually cropping up during our inventory of the Society's collection. Readers will remember our Tudor coin, mentioned in the August 2012 newsletter. The most recent items of note have created a link between the Passaic County Historical Society and the film actor Humphrey Bogart (1899-1957).


This discovery manifested itself in the form of two hatbands, both from sailors' caps. The first reads SS *Vaterland* while the second reads *USS Leviathan*. Despite the different names, these two hatbands both refer to the same vessel. Originally a German

owned ship, launched in 1913, the SS Vaterland was in harbor in New York City when war broke out in Europe. Unable to return to Germany, she sat in a Hoboken terminal until the United States Shipping Board seized her in 1917.

Renamed the *USS Leviathan*, she began transporting soldiers to and from the battlefields of Europe in early 1918. It was during the ship's time as the *USS Leviathan* that she was home to a young Humphrey Bogart who had joined the US Navy in 1918. After the Armistice, the crew continued to ferry troops back to America's shores. By 1919 the ship had again returned to Hoboken, where it remained until in 1922 it was refurbished and renamed the *SS Leviathan*.

Efforts to learn more information about the donor and his possible connection to the *USS Leviathan* have yet to be fruitful. The con-

nection between donor C.A. Ward and the ship remains unclear. However, based on other items donated at the same time, it seems likely that he served in WWI. He may have been one of the many soldiers transported in one of the USS Leviathan's
